introduction

- Giant pandas stand between two and three feet tall.

Food

Habitat

- Giant pandas live in coniferous forest with dense bamboo.
- Torrential rains or dense mist throughout the year characterizes these forests, often shrouded in heavy clouds.

Life cycle

- After a male and female panda mates, the female panda gives birth. If the mother gives birth to twins, she picks one and abandons the other for it to die in the mountains. When a cub is first born, they are very small, blind, pink and furless. The newborn cubs usually weigh up to about 150 grams or less, or it can weigh about 5 ounces. When it is first born, you may not even realize it is going to someday become bigger and more panda like.
